






How To Make Lucky Paper Stars!

Dia de los Muertos





As defined by Merriam-Webster, fascism is a "political philosophy, movement, or regime that exalts nation and often race above the individual and that stands for a centralized autocratic government headed by a dictatorial leader, severe economic and social regimentation, and forcible suppression of opposition." To sum it up is a dictatorship that strives for complete control over everything in the nation. This political system has been a long present issue in various nations throughout history. A major one of these such nations is Brazil which has an extensive history of fascism. Their first major, modern-ish example happened in 1964 after a coup d'etat occur<mark>red and</mark> established a <mark>dictatorsh</mark>ip that would run on for 21 years. This coup was sparked by the newly invented left-wing agenda provided by their new president. This agenda greatly upset the Brazilian military, and eventually, the conservative Catholic church was present there. These two major factions eventually led a coup d'etat along with the United States and overthrew the leader. Their leadership continued for a while until 1985 when a civilian leader was put in charge. Fascism is still a large problem in the modern world despite the typical denials of the public. In 2018, Brazil elected fascist leader, Jair Bolsonaro, who declared "Let's shoot the left-wing supporters!" Directly after this dictator was elected, a wave of major political deaths occurred. Over the course of just a few months, a large variety of people had died, all of whom had one thing in common; they rejected Bolsonaro. This is not all he has done however, he has also engaged in attacks on the Brazilian education system, as well as, persecution against a multitude of artists and the press. Yet, finally, his reign of terror ended as he has been voted out during the 2022 Brazilian presidential election.

Neo-Soul: The Ever Rising Music Genre By: Yoyo C.

In 1997, Erykah Badu, a singer, and songwriter released her debut album *Baduzium*. The tracks within it amazed the crowd with their aspects of many African-American started genres, such as jazz, R&B, funk, and soul. Badu's record company, Motown's Records' Kedar Massenburg, would come to market this splendid blend of tunes as **Neo-Soul**.

Neo-Soul sprouted in the 1990s along with a new generation of artists. Most African-Americans looked at their own culture of music and witnessed the clash of '70s soul with upcoming styles like hip-hop and R&B. People who contributed to Neo-Soul creation took inspiration from the generation before them's era of Black Power and soul music but still wanted to make music with what was trendy as of their times. While as mentioned earlier, Erykah Badu is thought to have been the first to market this genre, there were also songs published beforehand that are now considered Neo-Soul. Take D'angelo's *Brown Sugar*, for example.

Not only are sound and style considered in this genre, but topics within lyrics are affected too. With the strength of the powerful black movement still reminiscing, many cultural references are present within Neo-Soul tracks. Other present matters in these types of songs may be justice, injustice, sexism, and so much more on the struggles minorities faced and still face to this day. Neo-Soul was built by these minorities coming to power and creating something with their feelings, practically making the title "minority" a joke.

In the modern day, 2022, music, Neo-Soul is still present. Flourishing singer-songwriters like Steve Lacy, Tyler, the Creator, Thundercat, Daniel Caesar, WILLOW, and many more prove this. One thing for sure is that this genre is advancing as more elements from other styles of music are incorporated. Eventually, a new genre of music may emerge from Neo-Soul, as once enough things have been added, it will be something entirely new.
