



## Where Did The Modern Washing Machine Originate?



Washing machines are one of the most essential home appliances in history. Who wouldn't want to have their clothes washed for them and also have them come out cleaner than humans? But a question you probably haven't asked is, Where did the washing machine come from? Let's find out where and when this revolutionary invention came into being. Around the 1850s, we were in the midst of an industrial revolution. Many great things came out of this era, including the modern washing machine. In 1851, James King patterned the "drum" washing machine. It was primarily mechanical and didn't have the iconic "spin". The "spin" wasn't added until seven years later, when Hamilton Smith patterned the rotary washing machine. We can skip to 1908, when we got the first ever electrical device called "The Thor". And eventually, by 1937, they were fully automatic, like today. Some with or without any electrical component. From mechanical to automated, there's no doubt that washing machines have come a long way from what they used to be.

# Fashion's Impact on the Environment

Fashion defines who we are and it is a fundamental part of showing how you define yourself and decide who you are, however, fashion has a cost. The fashion industry is responsible for 10% of the world's carbon emissions and is only rising. In the 1980s, the average American bought 12 articles of clothing every year, but in 2019, the average American buys 68 new articles of clothing every year, which is a 567% increase from the 1980s to 2019, this clothing problem only worsens when you realize that, compared to the year 2000, we are keeping garments only half as long. Clothing uses materials that come from oil like polyester, spandex and nylon, using up around 342 million barrels of oil every year. Other fabrics, like viscose and rayon, use trees from forests. "After the forest are cleared, the wood is pulped and processed into fabrics called rayon and viscose, but it's shockingly wasteful. As much as 70% of the harvested wood is dumped or incinerated. Just 30% ends up in the garments that we wear." (Patriot act with Hasan Minhaj 14:30) The chemical process of creating clothing is also harming the environment as well. Making clothes, manufacturing fabrics, processing, dying, all create poisonous chemicals that are often dumped into rivers, like the Indonesian river, which many people nearby use for survival, including drinking. This causes the people near the rivers to intake those chemicals, making them sick. In 2016, the average American throws away 80 pounds of clothes every year, with those thrown away clothes going to landfills and being burnt. Although it sounds beneficial, donating clothes doesn't improve the world, ethier. For places like Goodwill, anything that isn't given away in a month often ends in landfills in developing countries. The way companies get away with destroying the environment is because of a technique called "greenwashing", greenwashing is an action companies perform to create an illusion that they are more environmentally friendly than how they really are. Fortunately, there is a solution, and a very simple solution as well. Wearing your clothes longer or buying used clothes. "If everyone bought one used item this year, instead of new, it could save nearly six pounds of CO2 emissions. That's equivalent to removing half a million cars off the road for a year." (Patriot act with Hasan Minhaj 28:32) buying garments from someone secondhand or wearing your clothes longer would be as helpful as removing half a million cars off the road for a whole year, and with all the environmental harm that fashion imposes, that is the best option we can take to save our world from pollution.

## War in Sudan By: Courtney Z.

On April 15, heavy gunfire and explosives broke out in Sudan's capital of Khartoum between the Sudanese army and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF). Since April 15, General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan of the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and General Mohamed Hamdan "Hemedti" Dagalo have been fighting for control of the East African country.

By late September, 4 million Sudanese civilians have been internally displaced while another 1.1 million have fled to neighboring countries such as South Sudan, Egypt, Chad, etc. Currently, 24.7 million people, so around half the country's population are in need of humanitarian assistance and protection. On June 19, international donors pledged a total of \$1.5 billion toward humanitarian aid and assistance for Sudan, according to the UN, after it had called on other countries to increase their efforts in aid.

In Sudan's western Darfur region, which was a sight of a genocidal movement back in the 2000s, has turned into a scene of ethnic violence and genocide, with the RSF and other affiliated Arab militias attacking ethnic African groups in the region. Furthermore, the country has seen a huge spike in gender-based and sexual violence of up to 50% ever since the warfare started. Multiple cases have shown that at least 19 of these incidents were perpetrated by men wearing RSF uniforms, but "the actual number of cases is likely much higher".

Multiple ceasefires have been discussed between both warring sides to allow humanitarian aid for those in need but most have been violated or fighting has begun immediately after. Peace negotiations were discussed between the US and Saudi Arabia back in June, in Saudia Arabia's coastal city of Jeddah.



October 9th, 1986, The Phantom of the Opera made its debut. Phantom of Opera is one of the most famous and popular Broadway musicals and it is celebrating its 37th year of being in theater. Uganda gained independence from British rule in 1962.

October 10th, 1933, United Airlines Boeing 247 Explosion. An airplane that was flying from Newark, New Jersey to Oakland, California exploded mid-air and crashed near Indiana.
