



Damien K - Deadly Plants (and how to not eat them)-

Deadly plants are everywhere on earth. I wouldn't be surprised if you didn't potentially have a poisonous

plant outside your front door! Here are some of the dangerous, the pretty, and the annoying.

Speaking of annoying, most drama teachers in your elementary years have taught you about the dangers of eating *Poinsettia* in your winter school plays, but if not, these flowers can cause mouth rashes and sour stomach aches if ingested by a child or a pet. It's fairly easy to recognise this plant with its huge red petals. Some plants even outright tell you they are deadly, like the *Deadly Nightshade* (hence the name). Ingesting any part of this plant can cause blurred vision, a rash, headaches, slurred speech, hallucinations, convulsions and eventually death. This plant can be recognised by its purplewhite petals and the pitch black berries connecting a small stem to the actual stem.

One of my favourite deadly plants is Digitalis purpurea, commonly known as Foxglove. There are two ways that Foxglove can kill you; through just eating it or drinking it through tea. Eating and/or drinking Foxglove (tea) can result in fatal arrhythmias where initially the heartbeat becomes irregular and if the dose is enough may cause cardiac arrest. This plant can be recognised by its beautiful, downwardsfacing flowers. A very pretty and seemingly innocent flower called the Mountain Laurel is by far one of the most dangerous of the bunch listed here. This flower can cause pain, cold sweats, nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, numbness, dizziness, headache, fever, loss of vision, muscle weakness, serious heart and lung problems, death, and other severe side effects. Mountain Laurel can be recognized by the fused petals of mountain laurel's florets are shaped like an inverted parasol.

The most deadly flower in the United States by far is the *Water Hemlock*, a flower commonly mistaken for beautiful Queen Anne's Lace. This highly potent flower can cause drooling, nausea, vomiting, wheezing,

sweating, dizziness, stomach pain, flushing, weakness/tiredness (lethargy), delirium, and uncontrollable bowel movements, only in the first stages of its poisoning, followed by more erious symptoms including trouble breathing, convulsions, heart problems, kidney failure, coma, and death. All plant parts are poisonous and can cause death in as little as 15 minutes. To recognise this plant, you must look for small, white flowers that grow in umbrella-like clusters. Side veins of the leaves lead to notches, not to tips at the outer margin. The thick rootstalk of water hemlock contains several small chambers. And lastly, to our deadly facade of flowers, we have what might be the prettiest of them all. The Lily of the Valley, or Convallaria majalis, is a small flower commonly said to relate to love concepts. This flower is very, very deadly to the touch and for indigestion. Consuming this flower can lead to severe illness, cardiac distress, and even death. Lily of the Valley is very recognisable with their downward-facing petals/buds with a stem that hangs into a hook shape. All of these flowers are at least relatively deadly, and all of them are relatively common in the world. I hope that this brochure helped so that when you're out hiking or just lost in a forest, you won't shove these flowers in your mouth thinking that they're good food.


carter. 3 Why Florida is sinking, and fast.

Many of the rich people you can name have done tax evasion, including Jeff Bezos, Elon Musk, and Warren Buffett. Even Joe Biden's son has done tax evasion. Rich people do not usually suffer consequences, it is very rare for them even to get a slap on the wrist. Consequences are different for the Middle class and lower though, with the average punishment of 3-5 years of prison time. This is a broken system, which rich people fund. Even though America is for the "people", it seems like only the top 1% of people matter. Rich people evade around 163 billion dollars a year, a quite costly amount. America often puts on a facade, as America calls itself "free", but America repeatedly contradicts that statement with its actions and history. The government has implemented many other things to collect as much money as they possibly can. The whole ordeal with the government not telling citizens how much money they owe in taxes is another way of taking as much money as possible. Companies are built to count people's taxes for them, like H&R Block. These companies use a tactic called lobbying, which is "influencing" a politician/action, very commonly with money. Many argue this is a form of legal bribing. If a person does not pay a company like this and count their taxes, they risk miscounting their taxes and they land in jail. Around 80% of people (30 million) made a mistake in 2019 that could land them in jail. This benefits the government as the companies pay them and anyone who lands in jail contributes to the prison monopoly. This system is not efficient and it is corrupt, although it doesn't seem like this is going to change anytime soon.


California's Minimum Wage Increase

California is the most expensive state to live in, with the poverty line being around 37,000 dollars for a family of four, and 30,000 dollars is the national average for a family of four. Working a minimum wage job isn't enough to afford basic necessities in California since the minimum wage is \$11 an hour. However, California increased the minimum wage to \$15.50 an hour, or \$16 an hour if the employer has over 25 employees. People who are working minimum wage jobs now have more funds to purchase all the expensive necessities they require like oil, rent, and even putting food and water on their table. The new minimum wage increase will be starting on January 1st, 2024, and when the law goes into effect thousands if not, millions of Americans a raise when they start the new year.

The Wild West Era

The Old West, more popularly known as the Wild West, was an era mostly occurring in the U.S. that 🤻 lasted from the early-mid 19th century to the early 20th century. The streets, towns, and the wilderness were all filled with outlaws and gunslingers, lawmen and bounty hunters, and all other sorts of misfits. Many popular names from the era are Billy the Kid, Jesse James, and Butch Cassidy, all of which are, or rather, notorious outlaws. Throughout the era, many problems existed: Outlaws and their crimes, oil and territorial disputes with the Natives, and illnesses including tuberculosis, cholera, smallpox, and typhus. Horses and, in turn, stagecoaches, were the main forms of transportation besides trains; Morgans, Kentucky saddlers, and Tennessee walkers were common riding horses among American cowboys, while Mexican cowboys (vaqueros) often rode Andalusians and Arabians. Draft horses such as shire horses, Belgians (horse breed not the human ethnicity), Suffolk Punch, and Ardennes pulled stagecoaches and wagons. Many places, mainly in the U.S., still have cowboys, or people that live like cowboys, at least. Texas and other Southern states are probably your first guess, but plenty of Northern states have cowboys, too; Most notably Utah, Kansas, Colorado, Wyoming, and Montana. Many people with the cowboy lifestyle own and live on ranches with farms, barns, and open land. Cowboys don't need to be Southern or have Southern accents, necessarily, and there's a wide variety of cowboy styles/categories and subcategories depending on where they're from. The cowboy clothing style also has many variations, but the most popular and well-known style/outfit is the hat, vest, jeans/work pants, and boots with spurs. Some cowboys add personality to their outfits by wearing chaps, adding decorations to their hats, or having personal belt buckles or spurs.




What are some crazy things you've seen in your life? Well, Some crazy things that some people have seen are animal hybrids.

This Week in History

- October 16, 1964, was the first Chinese nuclear test. The 22-kiloton uranium fission device was dropped at Lop Nur, a former salt lake that has now dried up. Because of this test, China became the fifth nuclear power in the world, among the U.S., Russia, France, and the UK.
- In 1978, Karol Józef Wojtyła became the first non-Italian to win the papacy, the office
 or authority of the Pope, after Pope John Paul I died after only 33 days in office.
 Wojtyła took on the name of John Paul II as Pope. During his papacy, Wojtyła
 became the second-longest serving Pope, after Pope Pius IX, who was in office for
 over 31 years.
- On October 17, 1989, Santa Cruz County, California, was most affected by the 6.9 magnitude earthquake: Loma Prieta. Around 60 people died from landslides and/or falling buildings.
- On October 17, 1973, OPEC (The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries), led by Saudi Arabia, declared an oil embargo on any country that supported Israel during the Yom Kippur War. This embargo then gave way to a massive oil shortage and long-time economic problems for Europe and the U.S., even after the lifting of the embargo in March of 1974.
- On October 18, 1867, Alaska was purchased from Russia by the U.S. for around \$7.2 million. Many American citizens found the purchase useless or unimportant, calling the act "Seward's Folly", named after William H. Seward, Secretary of State, who was responsible for the purchase. In 1967, the Soviet Probe "Venera 4" entered Venus' atmosphere. Information, mostly of the chemical composition of Venus' upper atmosphere, was sent back to Earth 90 minutes before contact was lost.
- On October 19, 2005, Saddam Hussein's trial began. Hussein was found guilty of crimes against humanity and was given the death penalty, which came into action on December 30, 2006. In 1954, Cho Oyu, part of the Himalayan Mountains and the 6th highest mountain peak in the world, was scaled for the first time in our recorded history. Nepalese Pasang Dawa Lama, and Austrians Joseph Jöchler and Herbert Tichy were the first people and mountaineers who scaled it.
- October 20, 1973, was when the Sydney Opera House first opened. Construction of
 the building began in March of 1959 and cost over \$100 million, and followed the
 design by Jørn Oberg Utzon, a Danish architect. In 1962, an unofficially declared
 war broke out between India and China. No diplomatic ties were cut, nor did either
 country officially declare war on the other. It was a border dispute from which the
 conflict started when China launched a two-pronged attack on the border. By the
 end of the conflict, China had taken control of Aksai Chin and both countries
 accepted a de facto border along what is now known as Line of Control.
