SAC board consists of 10 members and must represent OGA population (per OCPS requirements)

- Voting on Membership and Roles Decisions regarding officer roles will be at the next meeting.

Principal's Report (Announcements/HR & Budget Updates):

- As of today, 428 students enrolled
 - o 230 elementary students and 198 middle school students
 - Enrollment is up 12%
 - Had 376 students the end of last year, up nearly 50 students
- Budget allocated for 400 students expecting a kickback from district
- 0 changes expected in teaching staff
- 4 core teachers for 6th, 7th, and 8th but OGA is small
- Cost for all district teachers is \$77K (salary and health insurance benefits)
- Added lab tables back to 4th and 5th grade
- Re-establishing Junior Honors Society
- Lots of summer teacher training (professional development); M2 and M3, defined learning, gradebook
- School Improvement Plan: Guided model of this year
 - Two Areas of focus 1) Academic and 2) Culture
 - How are we meeting our students' needs? Differentiating EP?
 - Lowest area was science last year; Average was 85%, want to increase to 90%
 - Hard to assess learning gains
 - o Middle school science teaches 3 different subject matters
 - Ms. Lineberry created 18 page resource list to support teachers

Question of Science Fair came up – not sure if we have a teacher sponsor.

Question of SIP page 9 - high absences discussion (18+ days) - removal occurs in May & December
