

A Day in the Life of a Nurse Practitioner

Nurse practitioners have a hard job, especially in a big hospital. They run around, working with patients they might have a hard time with or even other nurses. Here is a run-through of the daily tasks of a nurse practitioner.

Nurses have to make sure their patients are healthy so they will have daily checkups with tasks like checking heart rate, measuring blood sugar, measuring blood oxygen, checking wounds if they are trauma patients, and more.

They also have to diagnose patients, they collect information about a patient whether it be medical history, bloodwork, or just physical examination. They then write a diagnosis on a patient chart.

They also make treatment plans as in a diet plan or a medicine arrangement. They also, when worst comes to worst, assess if life support is not working for a patient and if not, take them off of life support. In those cases, they sit with the family and patient in a private room to talk and sit with the patient in their last moments.


They also train new nurses. In residency, nurse practitioners oversee the entire nursing resident floor. They teach, monitor, assess, and grade the training nurses.

They also have their place in the office, filing paperwork, filling out prescription orders, treating staff schedules, and ordering supplies for the hospital. Nurses have much to do in just one day, and that could take at least a whole day to do two of those tasks.
