

[2] Due to the adaptive nature of this assessment, time will vary by student.

[3] The Civics EOC is taken during enrollment in the Civics course. Most students will take this assessment during the 7th grade year.

[4] Students enrolled in a United States Government course are required to take the FCLE (s.1003.4282(3)(d), F.S.).

#### COMMON FINAL EXAMS (CFE's)

CFE's are created and administered for courses that are not aligned to a state assessment.

Students enrolled in a CFF-assessed course must take the assessment.

Middle school CFE's are 60 minutes

High school CFE's are 80 minutes

CFE's are administered in May


